Wyldeewood Baptist Church has been involved in missions for over forty years and many souls have been reached with the gospel. We rejoice in the fact that we can partner with many other good men who are willing to answer the call and minister. The ***Omega Ministry*** is an integral part of the mission outreach at Wyldeewood and its primary purpose is to send **temporary financial support** to missionaries who are training national men to pastor churches. The reports below are just little clips on the ministries of some of the men that the ***Omega Ministry*** has the privilege of working with. Please read these reports and rejoice with us as God continues to show himself faithful to use what is given and multiply it greatly to reach so many with the gospel.

USA – Missionary K.L.

It has been quite a year at our church. We are praising the Lord for His mercy and blessings. We started to see to see new faces, one of the old faces from a couple years ago, and much personal growth in those who were still here. The Lord has done a mighty work here since the beginning of the New Year. The auditorium is looking full again on Sunday mornings with average attendance just above 50. I believe we have a very solid foundation for the future of our church.

Missionary B.M. – We have seen tremendous growth in some of our church folks, and as a result we have seen more first time visitors. There is nothing more encouraging than to see someone grow in the Lord and makes all the toil and hardships worth it. In September we had our first person start coming on visitation consistently and were able to see two ladies saved. One of those ladies has been coming to church and growing in the Lord ever since. In October we had 2 baptized as well as celebrated our 2 year anniversary here at our church. None of this would be possible without your support, it is much appreciated.

INDIA – Missionary J.M.

There were 97 souls saved and baptized in 4 months. The pastor also started a small new congregation in K.V. with 13 new believers. With our other pastor you are supporting, there were 102 souls saved and baptized in 4 months. He began soul winning ministry in 2 more villages and is praying to start a new church soon in one of those 2 villages.

ROMANIA – Missionary A.C.

We had a total of 10 new decisions for Christ as a result of the winter meetings in Nusfalau, 3 in Ghida, 4 in Doh and 5 in Cerisa and Marca. Nusfalau is our biggest village. The other 4 are very small and all have a place to meet except for Cerisa. This summer we have had a week of camp with each village and had over 300 children attend in 5 weeks. Many have accepted Christ as each one of the pastors, along with our family and Romanian teams, have worked hard to bring camp to each village.

HAITI – Missionary R.F.

Our pastor in Pravail reports that there have been 7 professions of faith and 6 baptisms in the last 3 months. The average Sunday morning attendance is 35. This work is in its 8th month and now has 22 members. All the churches we have started are pastored by nationals. As often as we can we visit these churches and rejoice as they report of souls being saved, baptized and growing in the Lord. We also notice that most are growing in attendance. We are considering the village of Ka Philippe for a new work to be established next year. Please pray for the Lord's direction in this matter.

MYANMAR – Missionary P.H.

Our missionary at Chuangtha reports that the church is growing solidly. The missionary at Yinanmah is having problems with his house. He is hated by neighbors but he does not give up at all. They still have a meeting every Sunday. The new mission field at Pathein is in good shape. We are planning to have Christmas soul winning too. The missionary at Mintung reports that their boarding is going on well. Most children got saved. Our vision is to reach their parents as well as their people. They have 15 children right now and 2 new families are added to the church. These children are our future for these people. Recently I went to Mandalay to encourage one of our partners who is actively involved in evangelism, mission and church planting. They are celebrating 14 years since the birth of the church and I preached on Sunday morning. They also have prison evangelism in 3 places. The pastor took me to the place where the ladies are being kept and I preached the gospel to them. They were very attentive to the gospel and the pastor told me that last year he baptized 12 people who had gotten saved in the prison.

THAILAND – Missionary T.S.

It is hard to believe that we are in Thailand. It is great to work with the pastor and his family here. You can do a lot more with a team! Our hearts love being in the village. We are praying that soon we can live in a room inside the church. Yesterday was the first time my wife and I had the services by ourselves. We were thankful that the Lord gave us 14 kids (not the same ones every week) for Sunday School. The kids had never heard of Christmas. Then we had a surprise – we had 9 come for the service. The Lord greatly encouraged us. There are 50 families in the upper village and 35 in the lower village. We have not visited them all yet as it is hard to get very far going door to door because they all invite you to sit down and visit. Many times they give us new rice they just harvested or bananas from their trees. We are feeling more welcome every time we go. They ask how long we are going to stay. If the Lord wills, our hearts are in this for the long run.
