### **CAMBODIA – Missionary R.E.**

This year we celebrated our 5<sup>th</sup> Church Anniversary with the theme: Always Abounding in the Work of the Lord. The service was attended by more than 50 first time visitors, 5 of whom got saved. Almost all of the members kneeling down and praying right after we gave the invitation to renew their covenant with God. One of our young men was blinded more than a year ago when he and his brother were digging the foundation of their house and hit a land mine. Our young people were holding a Good News Class every Saturday in different villages when they met this young man and now he is faithfully coming to church since the time we invited him. He is now saved, been baptized and is memorizing Bible verses during our Sunday afternoon service. Please pray that we could find a Khmer Bible on CD for him.

### **Missionary W.P.**

We have had some particularly satisfying salvation stories recently. One was a medical student from India and she, along with about 10 others, came all the way from India to study medicine here. This is a bit of a mystery because no one considers the medical system here to be very adequate. However, my wife (who is from Andhra Pradesh, India) and I were able to establish a friendship with these students. They were far from home and missed the Indian food. We hosted them in our house and gave them a nice homemade meal. We also had an opportunity to tell the Gospel to them on this and several other occasions. This one woman was a Roman Catholic who understood about God but she was not saved. After seeing verses in the Bible and answering her questions, she confidently said she understood about God's free gift and prayed with us.

### **BOLIVIA – Missionary J.G.**

A short time back, my wife and I traveled 63 miles to the village of Achiras where I had the opportunity to witness to many people who came to look for land to farm. They were from the highlands where they speak their native Quechua Language. Years ago, I learned the Spanish and Quechua languages, then for 13 years used them as a professional school teacher in the State schools. Thank God I can now witness in both languages. While in the village, in their Quechua language, I asked if they have ever heard about the Lord Jesus Christ. They said that in their original village, they attended church and read the Bible. Their pastor encouraged them to be faithful to God. I was very content to hear their testimonies and I told them to always remain faithful to God wherever they may go.

### **UKRAINE – Missionary C.L.**

On August 3, we had a baptismal service at the Prut River for 8 people that have gotten saved. 5 of those people were from the church in Novoselitsa and the other 3 from the church in Costechen. The man who was ordained in March of this year as the pastor of the church in Novoselitsa did the baptizing. He is 29 years old and is doing a great job. We had about 120 people there at the river. Please pray for the unsaved who were there. Some had never heard the gospel before. Also, please remember these young converts in your prayers. One of the ladies who was baptized is the former communist teacher that got saved and everyone in her family and all those who claimed to be her friends are against her. However, she is happy in the Lord and faithful to church. 2 others are the first ones in their families to trust the Lord and they also have opposition. The ladies in Novoselitsa made a meal for over 100 people after the baptism and it was a great time for food and fellowship. The 2 churches are doing well and we are still working and preaching in each area at least once a week. The pastor of the church in Costechen is 65 now and we are praying about ordaining a pastor to take his place. Please pray for the right young man to pastor this church in the days ahead.

## **NICARAGUA – Missionary B.D.**

Boy! That last group of 15 that Dr. Greg Adams brought down did a great job. They held VBS classes, held revivals and went soul winning every day. Over 30 were saved. Many of our Nicaraguan people were blessed as I am sure the team was also. The work in Puerto Cabezas has started a new church. This will be the second one in the Mesquite Indian Territory. They baptize in the little river that is near the ocean. They are looking for property for a new church. Let's really pray for that work.

## **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC – Missionary B.J.**

Praise be to God, we are back on the field again and what a joy we found when we returned. I had always had good reports each time I called the leaders of the churches to ask them how things were going, but when I returned and saw for myself what miraculous things God had done, it just thrilled my soul. It made me realize even more that they are grasping what they have been taught and I give God all the glory! All the ministries are running very smoothly and there was not one single problem in one of them. What a miracle of God! I am so thankful that these men have learned not to believe in belief, but they have accepted the consequences of commitment and their faith is not just within, but it shows without! Before we returned, they had seen another 8 souls saved since our last letter. And since our return, we have already seen another 4 saved.

## **BRAZIL – Missionary S.L.**

To kick off our six week Evangelistic Campaign we took one Saturday at the end of September to hold our Training Course on personal evangelism. We were excited to see over 65 participants sign up for what we call “*Evangelismo Por Equipe*”, translated “Team Evangelism”. We then divided the church into three teams, each having responsibilities in the areas of visiting, soul-winning, in-home evangelistic services, and missions. During this time we emphasize personal evangelism one on one as well as world evangelism. The campaign began with a week of prayer at the church each day from 6:30am and the on the week ending the six week campaign we will hold our annual Faith Promise Missions Revival. God is moving in an exciting way in Brazil and the Lord has allowed us to support many Brazilian national missionaries through the churches that we have established.

## **MEXICO – Missionary D.W.**

Please be in prayer for a specific man in our church R.D. He had attended another church in Caseta, but left because he said that he was confused about what the church was teaching and that it did not match what the Scriptures say. Last Wednesday during the services, he began to tell me that after some of the messages in the preaching services and Sunday School that he did not think that he had been saved like the Bible says and that he had only been baptized in water. Taking the Bible, I showed him how to be born again and with much humility, he placed his faith and trust in Jesus Christ alone as Saviour.

## **Myanmar - Missionary N.K.**

I was privileged to baptize 4 believers who obeyed the Lord in believer's baptism at Ngennung Village earlier this year. At the same time, there were 20 new believers who were baptized by me at my own church 2 weeks later. These are the fruits and blessings of our gospel works here in Myanmar for the past half year. I went to Singapore for a transaction matter in May and was privileged to preach at Singapore Xomi-Chin Fellowship on Sunday. There were about 120 people in the fellowship and I preached from John 14, which challenged the hearers and refreshed and encouraged the believer's spiritually.
